

SECTION 3

ORGANIZATION OF THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

Administratively, the College of Education and Human Development is under the leadership of the Dean of the College of Education and Human Development. All academic units within the College of Education and Human Development are under the ultimate authority of the Dean. A chart of the organization of the College of Education and Human Development is located at the end of this section.

The College of Education and Human Development is composed of three academic departments: The Department of Counseling and Human Development, The Department of Educational Leadership and Technology, and the Department of Teaching and Learning

The Department of Counseling and Human Development offers the BS Degree in Social Work, the BS in Family and Consumer Science, and the M.Ed. in Counselor Education and the M.Ed. in Marriage and Family Therapy.

The Department of Educational Leadership and Technology offers the M.Ed. in Educational Leadership and the M.Ed. in Technology Leadership. Also in 2006, the first doctoral degree to be awarded by Southeastern was approved: the Ed.D. in Educational Leadership.

The Department of Teaching and Learning offers the B.S. Degree in Early Childhood Education PK-3, the B.S. Degree in Elementary Education 1-5, the B.S. in Middle School Education 4-8, the B.A. Degree in Special Education M/M 1-5, and the B.A. Degree in Special Education M/M 4-8. Graduate degrees offered are the M. Ed in Curriculum and Instruction, the M. Ed. in Special Education, and the M.A.T. degree. In addition the department teaches all of the professional education courses for the degrees in Secondary Education whose degrees are awarded in the College of Education and Human Development.

In addition to the academic departments within the college, other units of importance contribute to the workings of the college as outlined in the following organizational chart. Other key units are the Southeastern Laboratory School, the Office of Student Teaching and the Office of Field Experiences, and the Center for Educational Services and Research (CEDSAR) and the Office of Assessment and Program Evaluation.
