<sup>†</sup>These 39 hrs will be used to calculate the major grade point average, which must be minimum 2.0

<sup>1</sup> Satisfies the Computer Literacy requirement.

<sup>2</sup> Speech courses chosen from COMM 113, 220, 311, 350, 370, 371, 375, 376, 378, 408, 410, 411, 413, 418, 463, 464, 465, 466, 471 or 475.

<sup>3</sup> Any combination of 1, 2 or 3 hour courses from any academic discipline is acceptable up to a total of 18 hours.

<sup>4</sup> Students must take MATH 92 if their ACT Math score was 18 or below, and if needed, must complete it before the end of their second semester at Southeast

<sup>5</sup> Students with an ACT Math score of 21 or higher must take MATH 161. Students who pass Math 92 or had an ACT Math score of 19-20 must take Math 155.

Students who completed Math 160 previous to summer 2007 are to be considered having fulfilled the Math 155/161 requirement. No substitution form is necessary.

<sup>6</sup> Students must take ENGL 92 if their ACT English score was 17 or below, and if needed, must complete it before the end of their second semester at Southeastern.

<sup>7</sup> Those with an ACT English score of 32 or higher may fulfill the ENGL 101-102 requirement with ENGL 121H and 122H

<sup>8</sup> Twelve semester hours in one foreign language (taken sequentially) are required. All four courses must be in one language either French, German, Spanish, Italian or Latin. If transcripts indicated high school AP credit, 101 and/or 102 is not required.

<sup>9</sup> One of four options: I. GBIO 106, GBIO 107, and any CHEM, EASC, or PHSC; II. CHEM 101, CHEM 102, and any GBIO course; III. EASC 101, EASC 102, and any other GBIO course; IV. PHSC 101, PHSC 102, and any GBIO course. Students in the '03-04 catalog and earlier have more options; check those catalogs for acceptable courses.

<sup>10</sup> Students must take 6 hrs of Western Civilization OR 6 hrs of American History, NOT a mixture of both. Students who complete 101 or 101H must enroll in 102 or 102H. Students who complete 201 or 201H must complete 202 or 202H.

<sup>11</sup> Any Philosophy course sophomore level or above. Any 200, 300 or 400 level History course. Any foreign language course. Any 200 or 300 level course in Humanities (HUM). Any Mythology course (MYTH). Any 200, 300 or 400 level course in English except 312, 321, 371, 372, 373, 380, 413, 414, 447, 448, 467, 482, 483, 485 or 486.

<sup>12</sup> If Art 105 is completed, the student cannot enroll in Art 106. If Art 106 is completed, the student cannot enroll in Art 105.

<sup>13</sup> Kinesiology courses must have a KINL prefix and a number between 100 & 372.

<sup>14</sup> Selected from Anthropology (ANTH), Economics (ECON), Geography (GEOG) except 205, Political Science (POLI), Psychology (PSYC) or Sociology (SOC)

<sup>15</sup> Not required of a student who transferred with 30 or more credit hours from another school or was a Southeastern student who had been absent for consecutive fall and spring semesters and had 30 hours completed prior to absence.

## LIMITED ENROLLMENT RULE:

Students are not allowed to enroll in any communication course except COMM 211 more than twice. If a student withdrew from a course, this counts as one of the times they were enrolled in the course.

## NOTES ON PREREQUISITES:

COMM 101: Must be completed before COMM 151, 159, 102 (198), 215, 291 or concurrently.

COMM 151: Must be completed before COMM 321, 340, 341, 344 or 345.

COMM 159: Must be completed before COMM 353, 451 or 461.

COMM 151 and COMM 159: Must complete both before COMM 256, 354, 357, 359, 421, 453 or 463.

COMM 151 and COMM 159 and COMM 211: All 3 must be completed before COMM 408.

COMM 210 or COMM 211: Both must be completed before COMM 311.

COMM 215: Must be completed before COMM 378.

COMM 498 Preparation: Students must retain relevant material from all prior COMM courses for the senior comprehensive exam required in COMM 498.

Students must complete the graduation application in order to register for COMM 498. All students must complete COMM 101, 151, 159, 198, 211, 215, 291 and 453 before taking 498. Students are not allowed to be enrolled in COMM 101, 151, 159, 198, 211, 215, 291 or 453 while they are enrolled in 498.

## NOTES ON CATALOG CHANGES:

COMM 101: Students in the 2002-03 catalog and earlier are not required to complete COMM 101. However, the prerequisite applies to all students now regardless of their catalog year.

COMM 198: Students in the 2002-03 catalog and earlier are not required to complete COMM 198.

COMM 220: Mass Comm & Journalism students in the 05-06 catalog and earlier can use this as a concentration course.

COMM 256 and 340: Mass COMM & Journalism students in the 2002-03 catalog and earlier can take only one of these.

COMM 341 and 357: Mass COMM & Journalism students in the 2002-03 catalog and earlier can take only one of these.

COMM 370, 464 and 465: Students in the COMM 2004-05 catalog & earlier can't use these as concentration courses. If student insists on taking the course to fulfill requirement, student needs to change catalog.

COMM 376: This course may appear as COMM 275 on some transcripts.

COMM 408: Students in the 2005-06 catalog and earlier can't use this as a concentration course. If student insists on taking the course to fulfill requirement, student needs to change catalog.

COMM 419: Students in the 2003-04 catalog and earlier can't use this course to fulfill concentration requirements.

COMM 453: Students in the 2002-03 catalog are not required to complete COMM 453. Students must complete COMM 220 instead.

COMM 469: Students in the 2002-03 catalog & earlier can't use this course as a concentration course.

COMM 498: Students in the 2002-03 catalog and earlier must complete a 3-hour version of COMM 498. All students affected by this requirement must contact Dr. Procopio.
