

Many students majoring in teacher certification degrees are interested in coaching athletics. In Louisiana, coaches of interscholastic sports are not required to complete an academic certification or take college courses specific to coaching. However, there is a significant demand for school-based coaches, and administrators often indicate interest in universities helping to prepare future coaches since the time spent as an athlete and/or as a volunteer coach may not provide adequate background. In addition to future teachers, other individuals have an interest in coaching youth or recreational sport, or coaching at advanced levels.

Many courses in the minor are offered on a regular basis at least twice a year. Those marked with an asterisk are offered on a rotating basis.
