



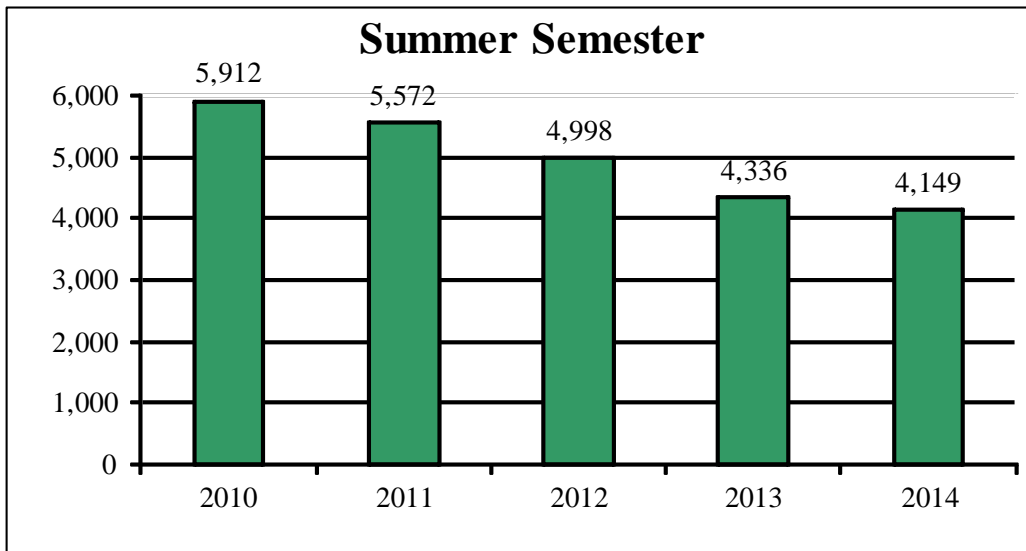
Semester Registration Report

Summer 2014

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 4.3% from the Summer 2013 semester to the Summer 2014 semester. This reflects a 4.6% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 3.3% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students increased to 30.0% of total enrollment.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.4 hours which is a slight decrease from 5.5 Summer 2013. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 4.9 hours, which is an increase from 5.2 in Summer 2013. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score decreased from 21.7 in Summer 2013 to 21.3 in Summer 2014.

(Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

Top Six Parishes

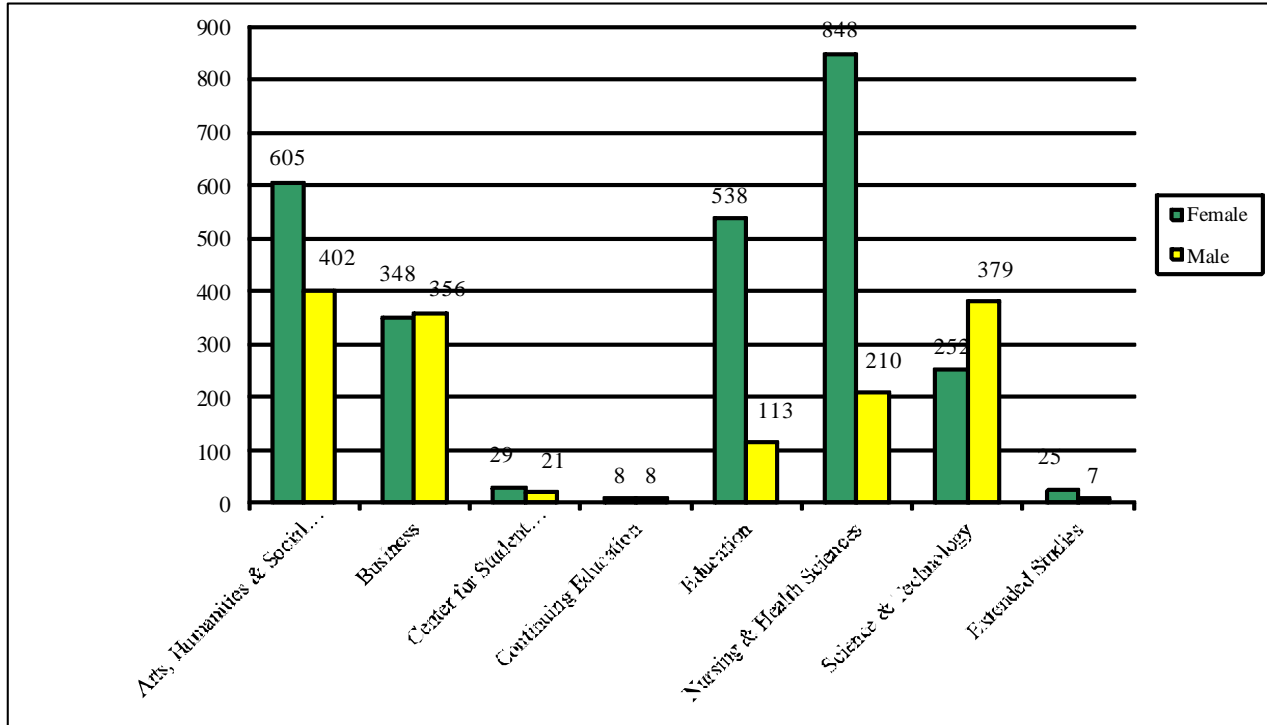
