

Current Student Survey 2008-2009

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Method

Participants

A total of 13,264 surveys were sent electronically via SurveyMonkey to a randomly selected sample of students who were enrolled at Southeastern in the Fall of 2008. The entire population was used, with the exception of students in the Early Start program, Southeastern Scholars, and those who were . Of the 13,264 surveys distributed, 85 were returned as non-deliverable. Of the 13,119 remaining surveys, 3,294 were completed for a response rate of 25%.

Of the 3,294 returned surveys, 73% (n=2,410) were female and 27% (n=884) were male. The vast majority (78%, n=2,552) were White, Non-Hispanic, while 15% (n=493) were Black Non-Hispanic, 4% (n=148) were other minorities, and 3% (n=101) did not report their race. The average age of respondents was 24.3. Twenty-eight percent (n=914) were freshmen, 16% (n=521) were sophomores, 16% (n=516) were juniors, 28% (n=906) were seniors, and 13% (n=437) were graduate students. The majority of the respondents were in the College of Education & Human Development (23%, n=767), while 18% (n=580) were in the College of Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences, 169 (n=630) were in the College of Business, 5% (n=171) were in the Division of General Studies, 20% (n=652) were in the College of Nursing & Health Sciences, 11% (n=377) were in the College of Science & Technology, and 3% (n=84) were in the Center for Student Excellence.

Procedure

The survey was conducted using SurveyMonkey. Students were contacted via e-mail in November 2008. Students who did not respond were sent reminder e-mails about a week apart, for a total of three reminder e-mails.

Instrument

The survey was developed in conjunction with representatives from the Student Government Association (SGA), Student Affairs and staff from the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment. The areas addressed in the survey were:

- **Student Activities and Student Life.** This section addressed student satisfaction and use of student services, program, activities, and offices. As well as how student's spend their time, campus involvement, and general student perceptions and satisfaction.
- **Your Family and Job.** Demographic information that is not readily available through the Student Record System was included in this section.

A complete copy of the survey items can be found in Appendix A.

Results

Technology

Students were asked to express their satisfaction with the use of technology in classroom teaching, as well as computer hardware, software, and instruction available on campus. They were also asked to express their satisfaction with computer lab locations, help available to answer technology questions, the use of the Technology fee to improve the technical environment at Southeastern, and the use of LEONet, Webmail and Blackboard. Overall, students are most satisfied with the use of Webmail (mean=4.35) and are least satisfied with the computer lab locations on campus (mean=3.53). Tables 1-10 provide information on all participants' satisfaction with technology at Southeastern, as well as breakdowns by appropriate demographics.

The second question in the Office of Technology section asked respondents to indicate how often they use computing services on campus, including word processing, multimedia (CD-ROM), world wide web, e-mail, spreadsheets, and the Student Administration System (LEONet). Overall students indicated they use e-mail most frequently (mean=4.52) and spreadsheets least frequently (mean=2.36). Tables 11-16 provide information on all participants' level of use on campus, as well as breakdowns by appropriate demographics.

Student Activities and Student Life

The first part asked respondents to indicate how important they thought various student services, program, activities and offices were. In addition they were asked to indicate whether they were aware of the service, if so, if they had used the service, and if they had used the service, how satisfied they were with the service. Overall, respondents thought Textbook Rental was the most important service (mean=4.79) and Greek Affairs was the least important (mean=2.65). In terms of awareness of the various services, Veteran Student Services had the highest level of respondents being unaware of the service (27%). Veteran Student Services had the lowest percentage of usage (19%) while Textbook Rental had the highest percentage of usage (98%). Of those students who have used the service, Textbook Rental had the highest level of satisfaction (mean=4.6) and Greek Affairs had the lowest level of satisfaction (mean=3.3). Tables 17-65 provide overall results for each item as well as demographic breakdowns.

It is also important to look at the discrepancy between the importance of a service and the satisfaction with the service. If a service is rated as very important, but satisfaction is very low, this indicates an area which needs to be addressed. Table 66 provides the mean difference between ratings of importance and ratings of satisfaction with each service, program, or activity. Students who responded “Haven’t Used” or “Unaware” for a service were not included in this analysis. The possible range is -4 to +4, with a negative number indicating a higher perceived importance than satisfaction. A positive number indicates that satisfaction is higher than importance. For example, if a student rated a service as Very Important (5) and rated satisfaction as Very Dissatisfied (1) then the difference rating would be -4. The area with the largest gap between importance and satisfaction was Financial Aid (-1.10), followed by University Police Department (-1.00), and Housing/Residential Services (-0.96). The area with the smallest gap was Lion’s Roar (.04) and then Southeastern Channel (.06).

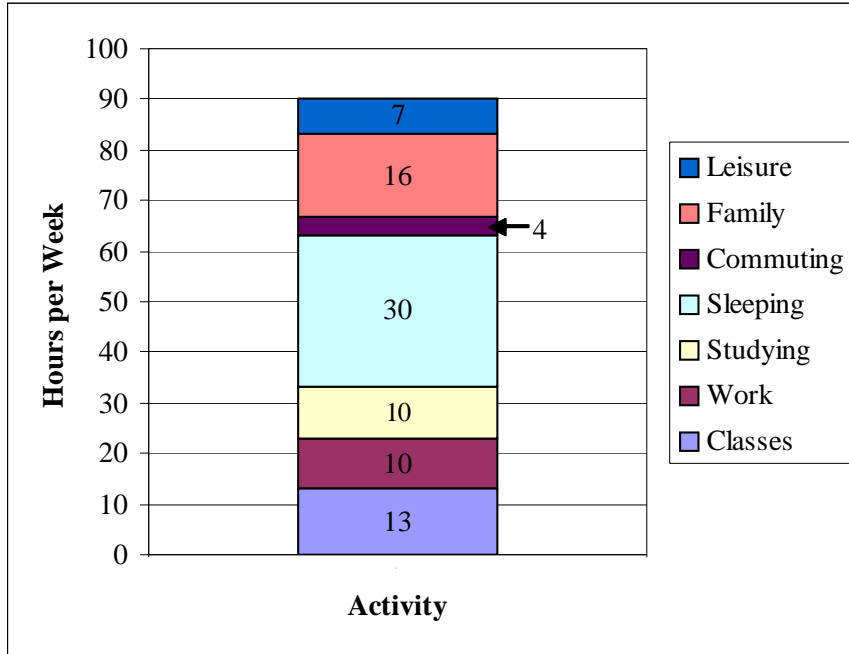

The item rated the lowest overall was “Being involved in a student organization has been a factor in my staying enrolled at Southeastern” (mean=2.17) followed by “I know a staff member with whom I would feel comfortable discussing a personal problem” (mean=2.88). The highest rated item was “I have experienced intellectual growth at Southeastern” (mean=4.15), followed by “At Southeastern there is a strong commitment to learning” (mean=4.14), and “I am proud of the quality of education that I am receiving at Southeastern” (mean=4.10). What is the one thing you would like to change about Southeastern?

Respondents were asked to name one thing they would like to change about Southeastern. A total of 1,509 respondents made a comment. The most common change was regarding parking (18.3%, 277 respondents), including dissatisfaction with the amount of student parking available, the amount tickets are written for, and a lot of dissatisfaction with the policy stating cars can not pull into a space backwards. The next most common change dealt with course offerings (7.5%, 113 respondents, including the lack of upper level course offerings, the desire for more internet courses and on-line courses, and the availability of certain courses. Below are other themes, in order of endorsement:

1. Eating options/meal plans (5.6%, 85) - including cost of food on campus and lack of healthy alternatives.
2. Fees (5.3%, 80) - mainly the need to pay fees for which students do not believe they benefit, in particular, the cheerleading fee was mentioned frequently.
3. Computer Labs (5.0%, 76) - there was a lot of dissatisfaction with the 24 hour computer lab, including the facilities and the fact that it is not open 24 hours.
4. Financial Aid Office (2.7%, 41) - this did not include dissatisfaction with the amount of financial aid received, but rather dissatisfaction based on interactions with the office.
5. Buildings/Classrooms (2.2%, 33) - including the condition of buildings, the temperature of classrooms, and the lack of technology in classrooms. No particular building was mentioned above others.
6. Math/Math lab (2.1%, 31) - mainly dissatisfaction with the reliance on computers to teach math.
7. Shuttles (1.2%, 18) - comments mainly revolved around having more shuttles running, or somehow ensuring the pick ups are made more frequently.
8. Lack of School Pride (1.1%, 17) - both at athletic events and pride in Southeastern in general.
9. Police Department (1.1%, 17) - this did not include issues related to parking, but rather interactions, or lack of, with the UPD.
10. Katrina/Rita Fountain (1.0%, 16) - students who commented on this thought it was a waste of money and in bad taste.

All of the comments are presented below. These are verbatim statements from the students, the only editing was to remove obscene language, spelling and grammar is as the student wrote.

- less lab hours
- family and consumer science's fashion merchandising could be brought more up to date
- housing it shouldn't take as long as it does to get a room if you registered late being a freshmen
- Add more parking without taking some of it away from the students and giving it to faculty...
- The campus should be more attractive with more landscaping. Also, parking tickets are far too high for poor college students to pay. I understand sometimes it's their own fault, but it very often is a mistake.
- Don't make students pay fees for services that they don't or can't use!!!
- parking
- Need better parking, and more dining options especially more options with meal plans. Parking and violations are too expensive.
- Letting alumni have all the same access to online databases and research information provided on the Library website that enrolled students have could be extremely handy in the professional field. Mainly all the online databases are what I'm wanting.

- The financial aid process. It takes too long. When you turn your information in, it takes them 3-4 weeks later to tell you that you have to turn something else in or the information was the wrong information that you turned in.
- I would like to change the way Southeastern and organizations advertise events on campus and not just post them on line. I also would like to change that vending machines are needed in the Student Union. I would like to change the parking and issuing of campus police ticketing. I would like to change how events need to be wanted on Fridays so people won't have to go home every weekend. Also I want to change qualifications to get into a Pan-Hellenic fraternity and sorority.
- If I could change one thing, it would be that the campus would look nicer.
- I would love to change the financial aid office. Since it is so important, I believe people who actually care and are not rude should work here.
- There should be more courses offered at night for non-traditional students.
- Not keeping track of attendance.
- The one thing I would like to change about Southeastern is more tutoring services being available to the student body.
- I wish it was closer to Baton Rouge! Well, I love the campus, but the commute is difficult at times. I'll gladly commute and get a quality education rather than go next door and struggle for a sub-par education. I love this school.
- The belief that students should have to be involved in campus activities in order to be successful in school. That is NOT true. I know plenty of people who don't participate in school activities and have all A's in their classes.
- Offer more non-credit courses. I wanted to take Music theory, for example, without having to take it for a grade/credit. Some people come to the university to enjoy and learn from a class without the pressure of a grade. So any classes that could be given for non-credit should be added with a non-credit/audit option.
- It needs to be more of a student living campus and not a commuter campus.
- The parking. The pathways make it easier for crazy drivers to act out.

- It would be nice if the administration would actually take the student teacher evaluations seriously, then maybe the students would take them seriously. I had a really bad experience with one teacher at the university last semester and so did many other students. I was sad to see that she was still instructing this semester after recieving so much negative input on one instructor.
- That they dont have enough residential life parking. It is to crowded and there is never enough parking spaces available.

- More online classes as I am trying to finish a degree while working full time with two children. It is difficult to get to Hammond for classes. My last three classes are not offered online when they could be and it will be difficult to get to Hammond to take them as they are only offerend during the day. Southeastern needs to help people get all the way through college in non-traditional ways.
- Improve maintenance of physical facilities. Computers in labs don't work, software on computers doesn't work or works incorrectly, outdated software programs; bathrooms have leaking toilets, doors that won't lock, doors which do not have hooks for your book bag, purse, etc.; ALL pianos, especially in practice rooms, are out of tune AND need numerous repairs (keys missing or broken, keys which don't work, ratty-looking benches, music spread all over the practice rooms; uncomfortable seating in classrooms and/or inadequate number of chairs which requires students' hauling chairs back and forth, ceiling tiles stained from water leaks, and dirty rooms everywhere; inadequate lighting, due mostly to missing or burned out bulbs, especially in computer labs. Worse yet, all of these maintenance issues have remained unchanged for the entire 13 weeks of this semester. - I would prefer SELU NOT have teachers enforce mandatory attendance. If students do not want to come to class, that should be their problem. Classes are for students who want to learn, and those that don't come should learn to deal with the consequences that ensue. Stop treating college students like they're in high school. Also, I'd like to bring back drop/add week. If Southeastern can change class locations and times right before school starts without notice to the students enrolled in the classes which alters my pre-planned schedule without my permission, I should be able to drop/add in the first week to still have a schedule to my liking.

Student Characteristics

The majority of respondents were single (n=1,702, 52%), while 13% (n=450) were married, and 3% (n=104) were previously married. Also, the majority of students had no children (n=1,834, 56%), while 6% (n=200) had one child, 4% (n=145) had two children, 2% (n=56) had three children and 1% (n=17) had four or more children.

Traditional college students are often considered to be single undergraduate students with no children between the ages of 18 and 22. However, due to changing societal and economic conditions, more non-traditional students are entering into universities. Defining non-traditional undergraduate students as those students who are over the age of 22 or married or have children, 42% (n=1,398) of the undergraduate respondents were non-traditional students, while 58% (n=1,896) were traditional students.

The survey results support the notion that Southeastern has a large commuter population. The majority of respondents (27%, n=891) travel more than 30 miles (one way) to Southeastern's main campus. The breakdown for travel to campus can be found in Table 97.

Thirty-eight percent (38%, n=1,253) of the respondents received financial aid during the 2008-2009 academic year. The majority of students (41%, n=1,346) work off campus, while 7% (n=223) work on campus, 3% (n=87) work both on and off campus, and 18% (n=603) do not work at all. Of those students who indicated they worked, 8% (n=138) work no more than 10 hours per week, 29% (n=484) work 11-20 hours per week, 30% (n=504) work 21-30 hours per week, and 32% (n=527) work more than 30 hours per week.

According to Terenzini et. al (1996), a first generation student is one who has no parent with any college or university experience. Using this definition, 20% (n=452) of our students are first generation college students. An additional 24% (n=524) have a least one parent with some college, but no degree. Seven percent (7%, n=157) have one parent with an Associate degree, 26% (n=582) have one parent with a Bachelor's degree, and 17% (n=387) have a parent with a graduate or professional degree.

Comments

The last page of the survey was reserved for respondents to make any other comments they wished to share. All of the comments are presented below. The comments are provided verbatim, no editing was done.

- 1. Please arrange some services for international student to go to walmart or other malls. 2. Health care services should provide medicines especially antibiotic on campus.They just provide ordinary medicines, not so effective in acute cases. 3. Some office should be established just to listen to problems of international students. 4. There should be a especial column for international student to write there comments in Loin's roar news paper.
- 45 hrs. plus on masters
- A rodeo arena would be great
- Add more computer labs, not enough labs available on main campus Maintenance of parking lots (repave, repaint lines, fill up potholes) Maintenance of restrooms (keeping restrooms clean) Add vending machines that carry testing materials (ie: scantrons & blue books; this would be very beneficial for the offsite SELU learning centers; we don't have to drive back to Hammond to pickup scantrons; most times we forget to buy the scantron or it is very inconvenient; also this would reduce long lines in bookstore; it would be nice also if you can swipe your Lagniappe card as a debit to purchase testing materials from the machines)
- Advising my first 3 years at college has been a joke! I'm a communications minor and my adviser wrote several communications courses I should try to register for. - Hope to have more core classes offered at the St. Tammany center so that it would cut down on my driving time and expense.
- I'm interested in seeing what this survey will help change at Southeastern, especially the lack of support for the humanities (usually programs housed in D Vickers Hall), some abysmal services (particularly on North Campus), lack of interesting activities that relate to many people's interests, problems with services for those with disabilities and the consistently failing elevator in D Vickers Hall, the highly unprofessional student newspaper, the lack of relevant books in the library, the stifling of free speech in student and university publications and performances, and a general lack of priorities when it comes to providing education and instead this need to promote image. The school's image will improve when the focus is back on quality education and honest service to the community.

- I would like to say that overall my experience at SLU has been mixed. I had some really good professors while attending SLU, these are David Wyld, Danielle Lewis, Mike Jones, and Rich Priore. I also got a ton of help from Dr Walker. Now for the bad news, when I transferred to SLU I was told by a counselor that General Business and Management were the two best degrees to get if your a night student. General Business has a marketing requirement where you can take mrkt 319, 321, 345, 4xx. I was told by the department head that it would be very difficult to get this class at night as 2 would never be offered at night and the other 1 is left up to the professor. I tried for 3 semesters to take this class before I just ended up dropping this major, I was a double major. Another complaint that I have is that the degrees are not specialized enough and there is too much overlap making a double major really not worth the time when you break it down. In speaking with different department heads it seems to
- I would like to see a free tutor lab for Chemistry on campus. I think it would be beneficial for a lot of the students.
- I would like to see elective courses in the use of software programs including MS Word, Excel & PowerPoint. I would also like to see electives in the use of statistical software such as SPSS. These classes should be available (and COUNT AS SEMESTER HOURS) for BOTH graduate and undergraduate students.
- I would like to see more supervision of student workers in crucial offices such as financial aid, records, and the controller's office. I have often received incorrect or incomplete information from a student worker who would obviously rather be anywhere but at their job. Student tech lab workers have been nearly useless. More training (or pay for qualified workers) for these workers would definitely help to get useful people in the technology labs. Some supervision would probably help here as well.
- I would like to see the Pennington Student REC center get new fitness equipment. The equipment seems to be very aged and it is becoming noticeable when using. Examples are loose or non-stable parts. That would help increase the students that go into the gym. Also, for future concerns it would be

nice to have another fitness area within the REC center as it gets quite crowded within it at certain times. Student housing needs an upgrade in the rooms as the rooms are being damaged over time.

- I would like to stress that off campus and internet students would like to stop paying all of the on campus fees. We pay a distance learning fee for every class we take off campus. I don't think the on campus students. Why don't you divide up the fees and charge a certain amount for each on campus class and a certain amount for each off campus like you do now for each distance learning class.
- If I have been disappointed with any department on campus, it's Housing. There is a pervasive mold problem which is continuously covered up or temporarily fixed. I can attest to being condescended to, lied to, and given the general run-around about having problems fixed. They have supposed fixes that make everything better but it does not. I have personally seen a maintenance room in which the lower portion of a wall was covered in thick black and green (mildew and mold). This is in Livingston Hall in the breaker room inside the mail room on the first floor. There is no excuse for this continued problem, and it is a strong liability to the university, which I know it has struggled with for some time. Many, many students have complained about this problem. At the campus infirmary, a nurse told me personally that she hears of mold problems "every semester." I have lived in University Housing since my freshman year, and nothing has changed (except the changeover to university control of Housing). I hope this com
- If the shuttle stops are marked, I can't tell. Southeastern's website has problems. Some links are broken and it hard to find information, such as the locations of satellite campuses. The only one I know about is the St. Tammany Center.
- If you are looking for comments on ways to improve the school: lower prices of food in the Student Union, get some normal "Grab-n-go" food, have healthy alternatives (salad bar!), and remember when advertising to students that there are students on the "Science" side of campus (Bio building, Pursley, SBA, etc) that might be interested in activities, not just around Fayard and D. Vick.
- in my experience the younger (newer) teachers hired seem to be horrible teachers because they do not realize that it is a college setting and not middle school. I have had horrible experiences with new young teachers in the past that really don't need to be teaching. Sot's don't help, these teachers need to be evaluated by someone in person!!!!!!!
- It is ridiculous we spend money on a parking garage that I, for one, have NEVER been able to park in, yet every time SLU has an event, it "welcomes" its guests to OUR parking that they get for FREE. Second, the whole police dept. needs to be fired so we can get REAL police officers. The black lady with 5 lbs of makeup and the white lady with the orange makeup need to go. They are rude and like to flirt too much. Those are about 90% of my complaints.
- It is the students that keep southeastern going, without us southeastern wouldnt be where it is. More emphasis should be placed on the students and not on the faculty. I do think the better professors deserve a raise, but not the best parking in front of the library. Also, it looks really unprofessional when your dean wears flip flops everyday.
- It is very hard to be a commuter. I have absolutely no money for a parking decal and I can't afford to come here in a car everyday. I usually take taxi cabs just to get to class. I only have one car that I share between me and my husband. He works and I can't find a job on campus that will work with my husband's school and work schedule plus mine. It's very difficult. I wish it was a bit easier for me.

- It would be nice to have parking hang tags instead of the decals. More available sections for Education majors (and other majors that have a majority at Southeastern, such as Nursing).
- its too complicated

- Just because my parents are responsible and have real jobs doesn't mean I should get less financial aid!
- just do something about the people you employ on this campus. Many of them have real problems in not knowing how to deal with students. Need to have better training for the student workers who work in the nurses office and police department and financial aid these are very important fields an most of them can't answer simple questions. Also parking need more parking for upperclass men all over the campus not just some parts.
- Less green space, more parking spaces. We should have hang tags for parking passes instead of sticker decals. Advising staff needs to be better educated on curricula. - Most of my professors have been excellent. Dean Barbara Allen has been a terrific Advisor. Leonet needs to be updated. Why still have semester dates still listed from the distant past. Would someone look into creating a class search for specific days such as Tu/Th or M/W/F classes? Thanks.
- My experience at SLU has helped me become a diverse person. Yes, there are difficulties in raising a family, working, and educating myself. However, the adventure is worth the trip. I only ask that more classes be offered during the evening or on-line to assist in achieving my goal / dream, a college diploma.
- My teachers are very good at their jobs; however. many of the staff and administrators are not responsive to student concerns. I also find them to be more interested in their own image and SLU's public image than in whether the students are being served well. Classroom discipline is almost non-existent; the teachers try to maintain order, and numerous students have complained about all the chatter going on in lecture classes, but to no avail. Is anyone evaluating the effectiveness and management skills of the department heads?.
- Need more parking, or allow students to park in many different places. Tickets are outrageous!
- Not enough parking Communication regarding re-registration not very good.

Dining facility's stock is never kept (spoons, forks, knives, and food items). I love the University, but there are some problems that need to be assessed. I am seriously considering the idea of going elsewhere for my education, because of how horrible some of the services are. The services are not up to par.
- The online payment fee is unnecessary and inconvenient. Staff takes the word of a teacher over a student any day without giving us a fair hearing. I had a hearing but it was unfair and didn't believe a word I said, he just nodded at me and then warned me not to do it again... I didn't DO anything! It was a misunderstanding!
- My only other comment would be that there needs to be an increase in the amount and diversity of graduate level English classes. I might just be biased
- The professors in the College of Teaching and Learning are wonderful!
- The school needs a lot of work. Mostly towards finding out what the students really want. Being hassled and over charged are not things we should have to accept to achieve a decent education. It's the daily things we try to overcome that become the hardest because the university seems to forget that WE are paying the Staff to help us learn what should become our careers and baselines of understanding the world around us. Maybe teaching us that no one cares and that the institutions will always pull a coup is what SLU believes should be taught, but personally, I feel there is a lot more out there than that. About 75% of my professors understood we were real people and truly tried to reach us. That percentage could be higher.
- The service people at SELU are not helpful. Callers with questions to records/ registration or library do not get the answers they need. Many times I have been transferred more than three times only to find that the department with the correct answer was the first one I called. Office staff should be knowledgeable about their department and other departments to provide optimal help.
- The social interaction is just about all. No connection with others which is rare. No sense of unity and what not.
- The University has let care for students fall by the wayside. SLU forces students to have to choose between their jobs (and fulfilling their responsibilities) and finishing their degree. The advisors do not seem to take into consideration that we are mainly a commuter school and that a lot of us are responsible adults who are trying to better ourselves. I feel penalized by our system here by having a full-time job and living off campus.
- The unnecessary ticketing of the police department has turned the group into a menace instead of a service. First of all, NO tickets should be given for the first week of the semester. When students have to wait 40 minutes in line, and many are brand new and without a clue, it is UNETHICAL to prey upon them to make a quick buck. I urge you, please do not make a new student's first impression of the SLU police department a negative one. They are nice people, but some policies definitely need to be changed.
- The business building needs benches for people who do not smoke. The smoking side of the building is the only side with new comfortable benches. If we are going to be allowed a certain number of prints it would be helpful if the printers in the general business building worked more often than not. union that is now for teachers but I had no idea that lot was taken away from the students. Why don't we have a first time warning when it comes to tickets? Also, who really uses the Union? The professors?!?!

I doubt I will return, and I am currently researching other schools in the area.

Why doesn't Virtual Classroom, Blackboard, and Webmail work consistently?? I missed a Virtual Classroom twice this semester because of malfunctions. Why should I have to stress over deciding whether drive an hour

- Too much homework. Not enough time or importance to related fields.
- Transfer courses should become more flexible for the working student.
- Truly I hope this survey has helped, yet I have little faith in any change in the obvious flaws of the system.
