**OBJECTIVES:** The goal of the program is to increase the number of small businesses that are prepared to compete for, and enter into transportation related prime and subcontracts.

**FUNDING:** It is the sponsor's intent to award a cooperative agreement to one organization in each of the designated geographical area(s) or regions. However, if warranted, the sponsor reserves the option to make multiple awards to selected partners. Cooperative agreements will be awarded for a period of 12 months (one year) with options for two (2) additional years. Cooperative agreement awards will be distributed to the regions as follows: South Atlantic Region--Up to \$138,000 per year; Southwest Region--Up to \$136,000 per year; and Mid-South Atlantic Region--Up to \$128,000 per year.
