The National Science Foundation and Tulane University will be holding a one-day workshop on Friday, January 26, 2007. The workshop will be held at the Lavin-Bernick Center for University Life in Kendall Cram Lecture Hall (Room 213) on the Tulane campus. All faculty and staff at Southeastern are invited to attend this workshop and learn more about the NSF and its programs.

The workshop will provide an overview of the Foundation, its mission, priorities, and budget. It will cover the NSF proposal and merit review process and NSF programs that cut across disciplines. Additionally, representatives from the seven NSF directorates will make presentations on their programs and will also be available individually and in breakout sessions for more specific discussions of potential research proposals.

New Faculty Workshop - Thursday, January 25th, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

This workshop is designed to introduce new faculty to Southeastern's Office of Sponsored Research and Programs. We will explain policies and procedures for submitting grants and spend time actually searching for grant opportunities.

Starting Point: Locating Funding Sources - Thursday, February 1st, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

If you don't know where to start, this session is for you. It's a hands-on opportunity to locate funding sources on the Internet including major federal agency offerings, Louisiana Board of Regents programs, SPIN/SMARTS (a database that identifies federal & foundation grant programs), & GRC (Grants Resource Center).

Writing Persuasive & Successful Grant Proposals Thursday, February 8th, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

Proven "key" elements of successful grant proposals, along with helpful hints for developing an outstanding proposal will be discussed. Creative and persuasive writing techniques will be included.

Preparing the Proposal Budget - Thursday, February 15th, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

This session will provide guidance in constructing a realistic budget. Personnel, fringe, travel, supplies, operating costs, acquisitions, & indirect costs are categories to be covered. Cost sharing/matching fund examples will be provided.

Submitting The Proposal - Thursday, March 1st, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

More agencies are requiring electronic submission of proposals. This session will familiarize you with the requirements to make the process effortless.

Meeting IRB/Safety Requirements - Thursday, March 8th, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

If your proposal requires IRB or Safety/ Hazardous Materials Management approval, this session will familiarize you with guidelines and processes for approval.

Administering A Grant Award - Thursday, March 15th, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

Now that you have an award, what's next? Knowing how to coordinate with Grants Accounting, Human Resources, & Purchasing at Southeastern will make the administration of a grant easier. Representatives of these offices will be on hand to provide information on procedures and to answer questions.

Understanding Compliance - Thursday, March 22nd, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103

This session will explore federal, state, and University requirements for proper procurement, reporting, etc.

Writing Sub Contracts and More - Thursday, March 29th, 2:00 pm – Tinsley, 103
