

DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL BUSINESS

OBJECTIVES

The Department of General Business offers a Bachelor of Arts degree in General Business with concentrations in Economics, Business Technology, General Business, and International Business. The Department also offers a two-year Associate of Arts degree program in Office Administration. The department's objectives are:

1. To provide students with a basic knowledge and understanding of business;
2. To prepare students to perform in various capacities in business organizations; and
3. To provide majors with several concentrations such as Economics, Business Technology, General Business, and International Business.

MAJOR IN GENERAL BUSINESS

In addition to fulfilling general education core requirements, students must complete 54 hours in Business including the prescribed courses in *one* of the concentration areas. The major in General Business leads to the degree of Bachelor of Arts.

HONORS DIPLOMA IN THE DISCIPLINE

The department also offers an upper-division honors curriculum allowing its students to earn an honors diploma in the major at graduation. For information about requirements and honors courses in this department, please contact the Department Head.

MINOR IN ECONOMICS

Students from other departments of the University may minor in Economics. The Economics minor consists of ECON 201, 202, and 4 courses from the following list: ECON 301, 302, 305, 312, 328, 333, 345, 362, 401, 402, 410, 412, 421, 441, and 450.¹ Students minoring in Economics are required to obtain the approval of the Department Head.

MINOR IN BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY

Students from other departments may minor in Business Technology by obtaining the approval of the Head of the Department of General Business and completing the following 18 hours in business technology courses: GBBT 124, 131, 210, 234, 253, and 351.
