

## DEPARTMENT OF VISUAL ARTS

Students seeking a Bachelor of Arts in Art Education are encouraged to be competent in studio art, art history, in the theoretical knowledge, and in the practical skills necessary to become a proficient art teacher. The student is prepared to teach art to people in the elementary and secondary schools, recreational programs, in parks, camps and in other special educational situations.

The major program in Art Education consists of fifty-four semester hours from the Visual Arts curriculum. Students must meet the following guidelines to graduate:

1. A grade of "C" or better is required of art education students in all art courses.
2. All Juniors must participate in the Junior Review. The review will take place the semester following the completion of 60 hours of the curriculum. The student must have successfully completed most of the following courses: Art: 105, 106, 111, 112, 151, 152, 231, 251, 281, and completed at least 6 credit hours in their specialty area.
3. All seniors must submit art works for the senior show and have at least five (5) artworks juried (by Faculty Jury) into that show as well as submit each of these works in digital or slide format. It is recommended that students participate the same semester that they take Senior Project.

### Honors Diploma in the Discipline

The department also offers an upper-division honors curriculum allowing its students to earn an honors diploma in the major at graduation. For information about requirements and honors courses in this department, please contact the Department Head.
