MYTHOLOGY (MYTH)

201. Greek and Roman Mythology. Credit 3 hours. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing. A comprehensive survey of Greek and Roman Mythology for students with little or no background of classical knowledge. Taught in English; knowledge of Greek or Latin is not required.

202. Germanic Mythology. Credit 3 hours. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing. The mythology of the Germanic people in relation to literature, art, music, and religion. Taught in English; knowledge of German is not required.

204. Mesoamerican Mythology. Credit 3 hours. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing. An overview of the mythology and cosmologies of Mesoamerican cultures, including the Olmecs, the Aztecs, the Maya and other Mesoamerican groups. Taught in English; knowledge of Spanish not required.

205. South American Mythology. Credit 3 hours. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing. An examination of the myths and cosmologies of diverse culture groups throughout South America. Also investigates the connections between South America mythology and Western literary and cultural studies identified by Claude Levi-Strauss. Taught in English; knowledge of Spanish not required.
