- Providing extended evening hours for individual/group study, computer use, and tutoring

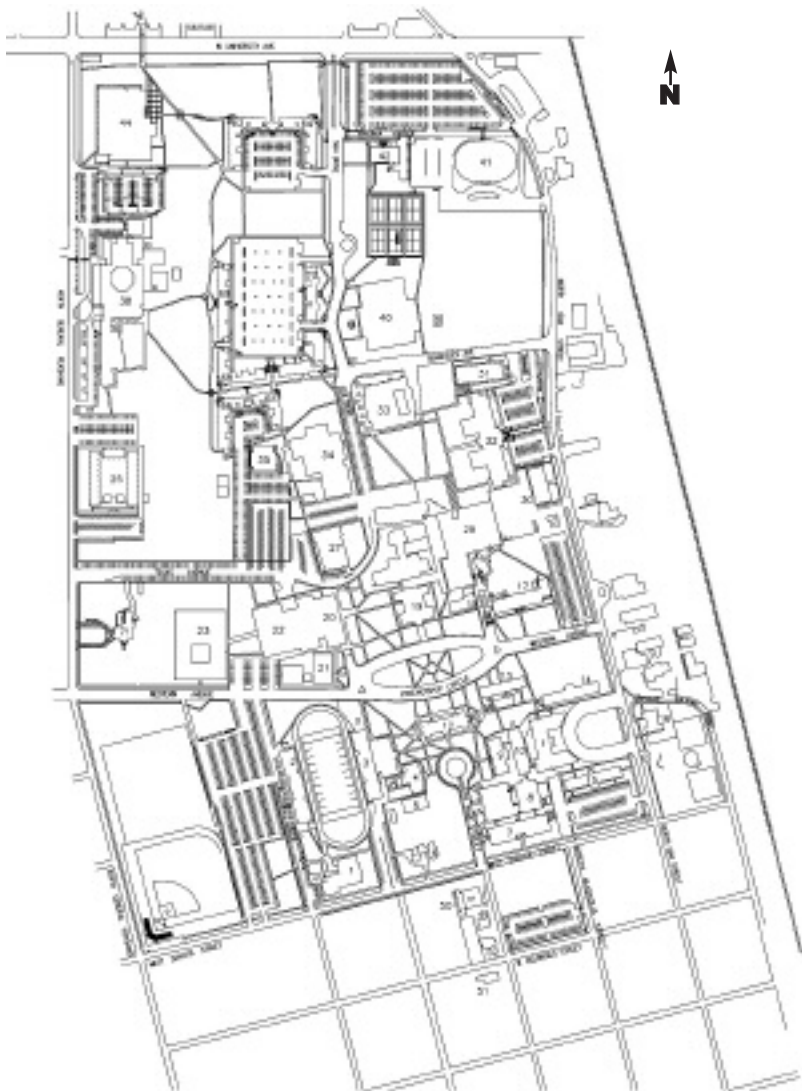

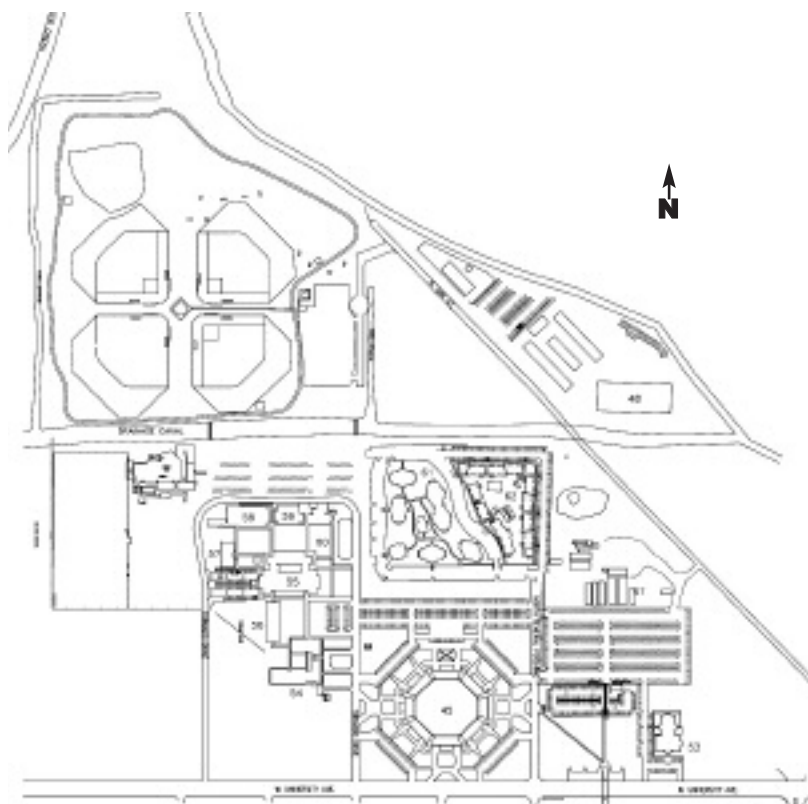
